Causes of Opioid Abuse

- Over prescription of pain killers
- social media
- perpetuating chronic use
- "so and so" did it and they are OK
- Lack of education
 - Prioritizing education
 - Making it more meaningful
- Not enough interference in the Hot Spots
- Lack of jobs heroin is cheap
- Lack of access to treatment centers and rehab programs
- Lack of access to Narcan
- Lack of education in healthcare community prescribing pain killers
- Big pharmaceutical companies promoting opioids to doctors
- Rice in health care costs lack of competition across state lines
- Peer pressure
- Lack of consequences on drugs' effect
- Only 1 quarter of health in school not integrated into other subjects

Causes of Racial Inequity and Lack of Cultural Awareness/Appreciation

- Gerrymandering in districts
 - Segregates school populations
 - more and better resources going to some schools
- Magnet schools are not accessible to everyone
- Lack of exposure to other cultures through study abroad/student exchange programs
- Lack of understanding about other cultures in community Haitian, Korean, Hispanic communities
- Unequal access to resources
- Parental involvement two-parent homes
- Cultures that are different are put down and labeled "other"
- Lack of sensitivity to others
- Not accepting differences
- Lack of opportunity
- Lack of multi-cultural fairs

- More diversity on TV
- Marginalizing other cultures in the media
- Lack of participation in community events breaking barriers
 - Lack of interest
 - Lack of advertising/PR
- Lack of knowledge
- Lack of volunteers who speak other languages
- Detention center and agriculture business bring more Hispanic families in the community community does not know how to deal with community change

Solutions for Opioid/Heroin Abuse

- Integrating substance abuse education into school curriculum Mandatory
 - History, English, current events/social studies
 - Scared Straight opportunities
- Hearing personal experiences in small settings vs school assembly
- Making teachers care through professional development
- Class discussions
- Surprise quizzes
- Utilize school resource officers
- Provide different points of views about experiences
- Scaring youth to understand consequences
- Social media campaign similar to cigarettes
- Prevention rehab centers, research
- Programs not criminalizing drug use Good Samaritan Law
- Reduce stigma of getting help
- Job availability instilling a sense of drive, goals, and meaning
- Opportunities for post-crisis discussions in schools and communities
- De-normalization campaigns
- Holding people accountable for actions –not getting into a car if someone uses
- Using peers vs authority figures
- "I'm not going to hang out with you if you do this..."
- Social media and celebrity involvement
- Mock crash experiences
- More respect for authority
