ENOUGH Initiative and Result Areas

The Engaging Neighborhoods, Organizations, Unions, Governments and Households (ENOUGH) Initiative is a first-of-its-kind state-led, place-based investment strategy designed to create poverty-fighting opportunities driven by communities, data and cross-sector partnerships.


- ENOUGH Act signed into law May 9, 2024
- Administered by the Maryland Governor's Office for Children
- Whole of government approach to ending child poverty

ENOUGH Result Areas













Cradle to Career Education: Unlocking children's potential through early care and education from birth until working in a career, specifically ensuring smooth transitions through kindergarten, middle school, and high school graduation with a pathway to college and/or career

Healthy Families: Ensuring community member and family access to high quality healthcare with goals of decreasing infant mortality, increasing life expectancy, and improving mental health

Economically Secure Families: Ensuring higher employment and entrepreneurship resulting in livable and family-sustaining wages, and stable, thriving households where families can provide for necessities, weather hard times, and build wealth

Safe and Thriving Communities: Creating communities where residents feel safe and where the built environment supports their ability to thrive, including through high-quality, affordable housing, a thriving commercial core, and access to recreational spaces, nutritious food, and transportation

Grant Program Eligibility

FY25 ENOUGH Grant Program



<u>Purpose</u>: Funding to eligible communities to create community-driven, cross-sector partnerships to plan and advance place-based strategies that reduce child poverty and increase economic mobility.

Basic Eligibility Requirements:

- ✓ Lead Applicant
- ✓ Core Partners
- ✓ Community

Lead Applicant Eligibility Requirements





Lead Applicant is called the Community Quarterback Organization

Community Quarterback organization may be any of the following:

- community-based organization
- non-profit organization
- local government entity
- Local Management Board
- Community Action Agency
- Should have deep relationships in the focus community and the capacity to drive implementation across multiple, cross-sector partners
- Presumed to be responsible for compliance, reporting, and financial stewardship of the grant award, but a separate Fiscal Sponsor organization is permitted

Core Partners Eligibility Requirements





Minimum* required partners include:

- a community-based non-profit organization,
- a local government entity, <u>and</u>
- a public school

*Expectation is that applicants will engage a broad coalition of partners across sectors.

Community Eligibility Requirements







<u>AND</u>

2. Are served by a **community school** with a concentration of **poverty** level of at least 80%

Three Grant Tracks and Requirements

Grant Program Track	Award Amount	Project Period
Track 1: Partnership Development	\$65,000	6-12 Months
Track 2: Plan Development	\$300,000	12-24 Months
Track 3: Implementation	Up to \$5M* (FY25)	Up to 4 Fiscal Years

^{*}Track 3: Implementation award is based on the number of children contributing to eligibility criteria in the proposed service geography. Proposed budget for Track 3 should include three additional years of ENOUGH funding. The Governor's Office for Children will help Track 3 applicants identify their multi-year budget limit.

Qualifying Criteria to Apply for Each Grant Program Track





MEETS COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Communities that have at least one U.S. Census tract where more than 30% of children are living in poverty AND (2) is served by a community school with a concentration of poverty level of at least 80%



COMMUNITY QUARTERBACK

Community-led organization with resources and capacity to lead ENOUGH activities and manage ENOUGH funds, in coordination with community partners



PARTNERSHIP COLLABORATIVE

A robust partnership of community-led organizations representing each of the ENOUGH results areas

An established partnership governance structure to ensure alignment, information sharing, and resource deployment



COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Completed needs assessment identifying assets and gaps, informed by community data and residents' input



NEIGHBORHOOD ACTION PLAN

An action plan that leverages various funding streams to address gaps identified in the needs assessment and provide a continuum of services for the community across ENOUGH results areas

^{*}Funding for Track 3 is based on the number of children contributing to eligibility criteria in the proposed service geography. Applicants considering Track 3: Implementation who submit a Notice of Intent to Apply by July 19, 2024, will be provided a maximum budget request and potential distribution schedule for the four-year project period by early August 2024.

- Authentically engage community members living and working in the identified community or geographic area
- Analyze data in consult with community members and integrate qualitative data from a variety of local perspectives
- Neighborhood Action Plans must describe structures, norms, processes and protocols that promote accountability to community members, particularly those with lived experience proximate to the issues being addressed

Inform

Community provides information to help you understand the issues, find solutions, and discover opportunities.



"We will keep you informed of our work."

Consult

Community gives you specific feedback on alternatives, analyses, or decisions.



"We will offer you our ideas and listen to your input as we make decisions."

Involve

Partnerships engage community to ensure goals, concerns and alternatives are considered and understood.



"You have opportunities to provide input at multiple stages of the process. We will let you know how your involvement influences our decisions."

Collaborate

Partnerships and community members work together, sharing information and some power in all aspects of the decision-making process to reach a shared goal.



"You have a seat at the table and are involved throughout the change process. Together, we will partner in creating and implementing decisions."

Shift Ownership

Community members/ youth and families provide information, find solutions and discover opportunities.



"Your decisions will drive the work. You have power and resources to create change."

- All grantees will be required to contribute to, and participate in, the GOC's comprehensive evaluation of the ENOUGH Grant Program
- Applicants who submit a Notice of Intent to Apply by July 19, 2024, will receive a community-specific Data Dashboard in August 2024
- Applicants and grantees are expected to examine local data disaggregated by race/ethnicity to identify systemic inequities and strategically focus ENOUGH investments

Prospective applicants will have access to a curated training hub and resource library focused on the ENOUGH qualifying criteria and result areas.




Grantee Support: Fiscal Mapping to Maximize Investment
