Meeting Overview: The meeting began with a warm welcome to all members, with a special introduction of MYAC's newest member, followed by updates from each member. After a brief break, the group reviewed and voted on several bills shared by the Legislative Committee before moving into a conversation about proposed by-law introductions and changes. After this discussion, the Council briefly conversed about the focus group for the MYAC 25-26 application. The meeting concluded with final reminders about Advocacy Day and aadjournment.

MINUTES

I. Welcoming Remarks

The Vice Chair opened the meeting by welcoming all members and providing a brief overview of the agenda. Members also welcomed MYAC's newest member, Jefferson Aldair Vasquez-Reyes.

Vice Chair Evans confirmed quorum for the Council to proceed with Council business.

• Chair Updates

Chair Hossainkhail has been communicating with different legislators to discuss support for the Maryland Blueprint and the possibility of town halls during the week of crossover in the legislative session. Currently, there are ideas surrounding potential town halls in Montgomery County and Anne Arundel County two weeks following the end of the legislative session. A Hagerstown town hall is also in the works with multiple members taking the lead on this initiative. Additionally, the memo to the Governor about a roundtable meeting with MYAC is in progress. Looking forward, the Council can expect discussions on the Council bylaws.

• Legislative Committee Announcements

The Committee will continue to hold meetings with legislators and submit testimony.

• Public Awareness Committee Announcements

During the bylaw review that will take place at the next meeting, there will be changes made to the oversight and functions of the Public Awareness Committee.

• Youth Grants Committee

The YGO Committee has its first meeting detailing changes to the application process and a timeline. At the upcoming advocacy day the Committee plans to speak with legislators about the grant and ways they can communicate the opportunity to youth in their constituency. The Committee has sent out 65+ emails, looking to reach counties MYAC has little to no representation for on the Council.

VI. By-Laws: Introductions and Changes Conversation

To improve the efficiency and flow of MYAC in future years, several bylaw changes were proposed. One of the changes includes adding a mandated Council training day, which will be held before the second Council meeting each year to review operational procedures, legislative items, and the structure of MYAC. Community partners will also be invited to this event, which will be required and included in the MYAC application process.

Another proposed change is establishing temporary committee procedures, along with providing clarity on member appointment positions and delegations. Additionally, the media role in public awareness will be removed, and media will be directed to two officer positions. Lastly, a MYAC guidebook which can be used to support MYAC members and outside organizations or youth groups interested in the functions of MYAC.

VII. MYAC 25 Application Focus Group

In coming meetings, the Executive Board and the full Council will be looking at the MYAC application. The application is set to open on March 1st using a newer system called Submittable. The goal is for all MYAC members to have an opportunity to engage with the application process and promote the application.

MYAC Advocacy Day will be on February 17th in partnership with The MOST Network. Members must inform Mr. Valentine of their attendance to ensure there is an accurate count of MYAC members participating.
